HB: July 27th-28th



MESSAGE FROM THE RS

"Every member of pony club should be sure they have a password to get on to the national website so that they have access to all of the resources that USPC provides. Two of the many valuable areas are Disciplines and Rulebooks. They both give you access to the rulebooks section. Even though we are one of the few regions still giving written tests as part of our rallies (one good way to use the rulebooks) – there are lots more reasons to read (or skim) over the rulebooks from time to time. They make great sources of material & ideas for unmounted meetings. Avoiding eliminations for rules violations is another important reason. For instance, it's very sad when someone gets eliminated for not passing through the finish flags. Rulebooks list tack that can or can't be used, include many of the forms being used at the rally, and provide details on the different phases of each sport.Don't forget the Spring Newsletters which are part of the required rally rulebooks. Now that the rulebooks are electronic, you can have the rules at your fingertips at all times (if you have a "fancy" phone)...unlike your RS who likes her rules in a 3-ring binder, covered in highlighting & post-it-notes from each time I read through them." -Ev, RS, NYUC
